We use 'has' with 'he' 'she' 'it', names of persons animals etc.

We use **have** with 'I' 'we' 'you' 'they', names of people, animals etc.

Had is the **past time** of 'have'.

Had shows past time.

I have a pet dog. I had a pet dog. (I do not have it now.)
