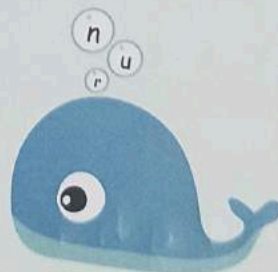
The Alphabet

Fun Activity

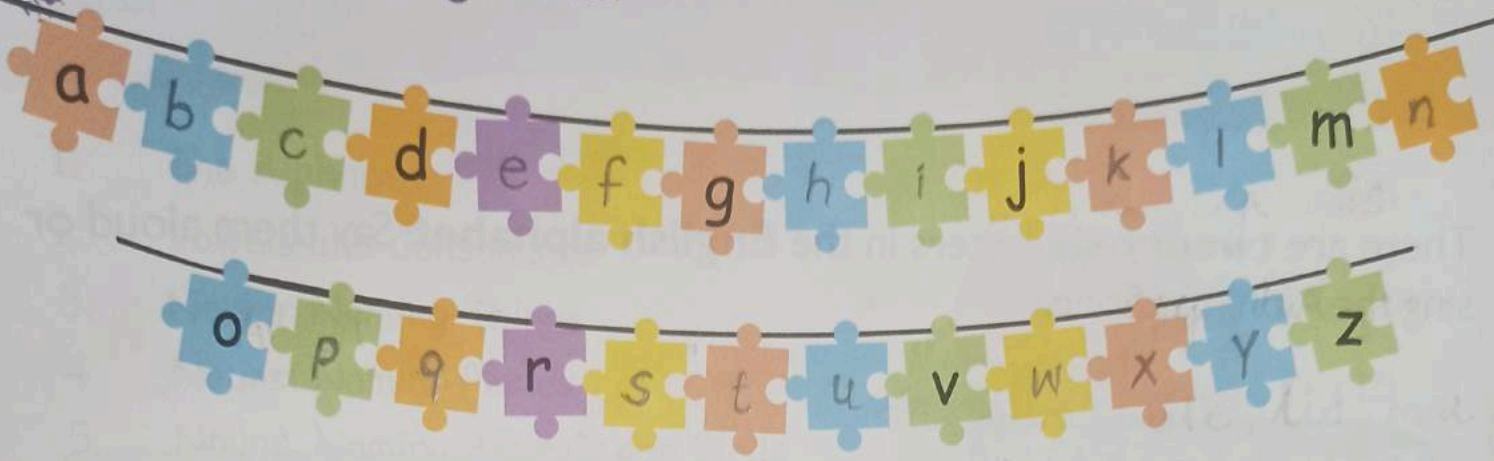
Draw a line to join each **small** (lower case) letter to its **capital** (upper case) letter.

Letters to be matched: f, D, A, y, d, A, m, w, c, Z, p, I, M, t, C, T, w, P, z, C.

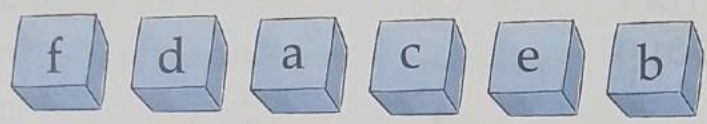


You should learn the alphabet well. All our words are made from these letters.

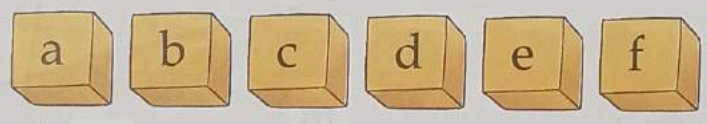

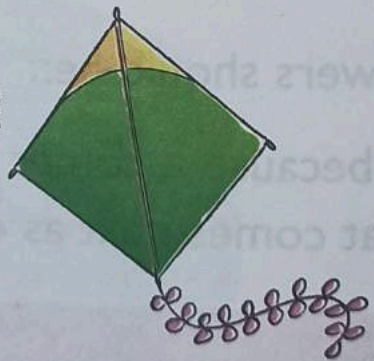
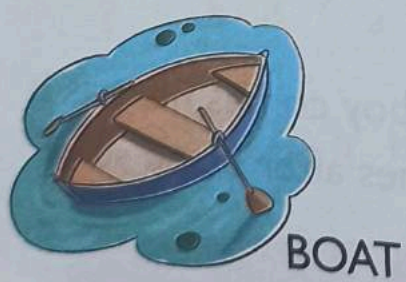
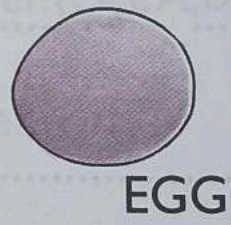
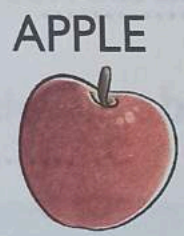
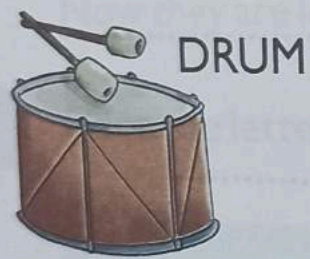
Now the words are in **abc** order.

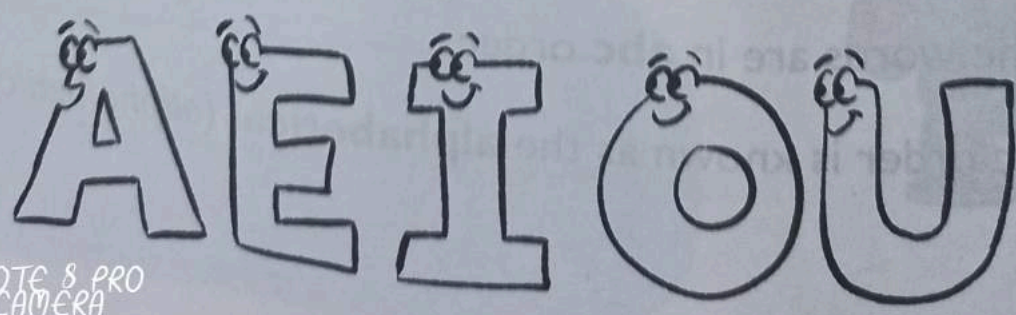

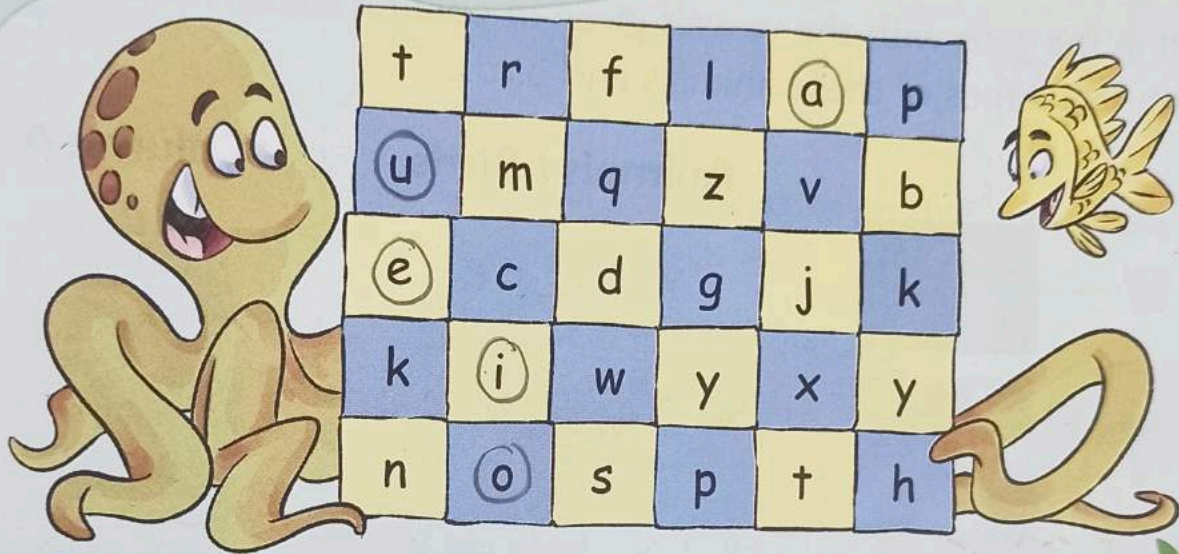

Find and **circle** the letters **a e i o u** in the grid below:

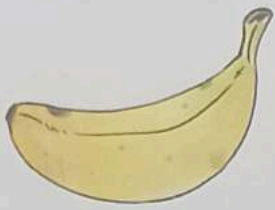


a e i o u are **five special** letters in the English alphabet. They are called **vo (va-wels) wels**. The other letters are called **con/so/nants**.

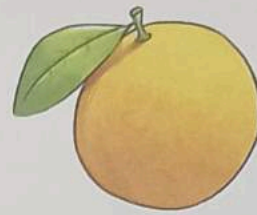
