**ANS-1 --Diwali celebrates the return of Lord Rama and Sita from exile after a period of 14 years. It marks the victory of Lord Rama over the evil Ravana. It is celebrated as a symbol of victory of good over evil.**

**ANS-2-- On the eve of Holi, a bonfire is lit which is known as Holika or Dulhendi.**

**ANS-3-- Muslims fast during the month of Ramzan .They pray five times a day and offer food and alms to the needy .**

**ANS-4 Gurupurab ,also known as Guru Nanak Jayanti, celebrates the birth of Guru Nanak, the founder of the Sikh religion. On this day, people visit the gurdwaras, offer prayers and pay homage to the holy Guru Granth Sahib Ji, the sacred book of the Sikhs. The celebrations last for three days.**

**ANS-5 Christmas is celebrated by the Christians on 25<sup>th</sup> December. People go to the church to pray. People decorate their houses and the Christmas tree .They also visit their friends and relatives to wish “Merry Christmas” and also exchange gifts, sweets, chocolates and plum cakes.
